More than just proof of payment for sending postal services, stamps are a forum for studying the history and culture of a nation, as well as the development of communication media and printing technology. You can also explore this knowledge at the Museum Prangko Indonesia, which displays stamp collections from all over the world.

The birth of the Stamp Museum began with the story of Mrs. Tien Soeharto who visited the PT Pos Indonesia (Persero) stamp exhibition at the VI Asia Pacific Scout Jamboree in Cibubur in June 1981. From there the idea arose to build a Stamp Museum at TMII, which was inaugurated by President Soeharto on September 29, 1983.

Inside Museum Prangko, there are various presentation rooms with different collections and exhibitions. Some of these include the process of making stamps and printing cylinders; a collection of stamps from the Dutch, Japanese, and Indonesian independence periods; 'search for memories' stamps and souvenir sheets from 1950 to 1993; stamps by period and theme; to thematic stamps about scouting and sports.



STAMPS OVER THE YEARS



The first-ever adhesive postage stamp, the Penny Black, was introduced in the UK, featuring a portrait of Queen Victoria. This marked the beginning of the modern postage stamp era.



The first airmail stamps were issued in the United States, marking the beginning of postal services being extended to air transportation.



Self-adhesive stamps were introduced, eliminating the need for moistened backs and making stamps easier to use and handle.



The United States issued its Forever Stamp, which retains its value even when postal rates increase, providing convenience and flexibility for customers.



Stamps in the 2010s reflected a blend of tradition and modernity, with designs celebrating global events, cultural icons, and technological advancements. This decade saw a rise in innovative printing techniques, including the use of vibrant colors, intricate details, and interactive features like QR codes.

Queen Victoria's portrait was used on the stamp, but she was not entirely happy with how she appeared.

The original design made her look a bit too stern, which led to the stamp being reissued with a slightly modified version of her image for later stamps.
